Wentworth Primary offers the internationally recognised Cambridge Primary curriculum in English, Mathematics and Science.

Primary School Students receive recognition and praise for demonstrating these values. As students progress through their school years, the aim of Wentworth Primary School is to ensure that these values underpin both curriculum and co-curricular activities, helping young people to develop an ethical consciousness

Assessments

The use and application of skilled and in-depth assessments is an important feature of Wentworth Primary School. Small class sizes enable teachers to develop a very good knowledge of their students – their strengths, needs, learning styles and next learning steps. Wentworth Primary School adopts two main forms of assessments: Formative and Summative. Both types of assessments are important in showing the strengths and needs of our students.

Formative Assessment, often known as Assessment For Learning (AFoL), is a key feature of our school. AFoL places the student at the centre of his/her assessment and encourages students to be more aware and reflective about their learning and their next learning goals. International research continues to demonstrate that AFoL practices lead to more motivated, higher-achieving learners. Formative assessments are on-going and take place daily in the classroom.

Summative Assessments are more an Assessment of Learning and are used to measure what our students have learnt as part of a unit or topic. This is a 'snapshot' of their learning and is used to tell the teacher what the student knows or does not know. Summative assessments are also used for reporting and grading.

Wentworth Primary School uses a range of assessment tools that are used for specific purposes. These assessments form an integral part of teaching and learning for both the teacher and the student.

Links with Wentworth College

Wentworth Primary School and Wentworth College enjoy a strong culture of involvement that offers benefits to both schools. There are a range of activities that exemplify this closeness that include a sports mentorship programme, leadership liaison and access to resources and facilities.



The bond between the two schools is best symbolised in full school assemblies, where Wentworth Primary join the College in regular formal assemblies the celebrate successes and achievements in both schools.

Each year a Year 13 perfect is appointed by Wentworth College to act as liaison between Wentworth College and Wentworth Primary. These duties include ensuring that the Wentworth Primary Students are aware of events that are occurring at the College. These duties also involve having regular meetings with the staff at Wentworth Primary to discuss initiatives that involve both the College and Primary students.

Sports Mentoring:

Many of the Wentworth Primary sports are coached by skilled and enthusiastic senior students from Wentworth College. This relationship is actively encouraged by both Wentworth College and Wentworth Primary. The primary students benefit from being coached by keen, responsible sportspeople who lead by example. The College students benefit through their ability to further develop their leadership and mentoring skills with their younger peers.

Resources:

Wentworth Primary students visit Wentworth College to access the school library and to use the College Hall for their annual drama productions. Student Leadership

Wentworth Primary provides students with the opportunity to develop leadership skills. It encourages students to show initiative and to lead themselves and others to help reach their goals and aspirations. Our students are encouraged to be responsible for themselves and others; they are motivated to 'give it a go' and strive to succeed

The students at Wentworth Primary School have a number of opportunities to demonstrate their leadership skills. In addition to the positions of School and Class Captains, there are also leadership positions relating to sport teams as well as a number of other less obvious situations that require tolerance and initiative.

School Captains are nominated from the Year 6 class and are selected via a school-wide ballot system. School Captains liaise with the College Prefects and, wherever possible, attend leadership related programmes. They take responsibility for organising fundraising events, and can be called upon to greet visitors and parents and to help with the play activities during school recess. They also form part of the School Council and are empowered to discuss school initiatives, values and activities.

Sports

Wentworth Primary views sport as an integral part of school life and aims to provide students with a number of sporting programmes. These programmes range from school sports, interschool sports and club sporting activities.

All school sporting programmes are organised and, where possible, coached by members of the teaching staff or senior Wentworth College students. This helps to develop respect and a sense of community between coaches and students.



Aims of Sport

1. To promote the opportunity for all students to participate actively in a wide range of individual and team sports.

2. To develop within students the qualities of self-esteem, personal fitness, team commitment, sense of fair play and school spirit.

3. To provide pathways and support for students to further develop sporting success.

4. To ensure that Wentworth Primary fields competitive school sporting teams.

5. To encourage the concept of 'giving it a go'.

Sports Policy

1. Players are expected to attend trainings and wear correct sporting attire to the training sessions.

2. Players must adhere to the rules and regulations of the Sporting Code or organisation for which they play.

3. Players must always display a sense of fair play and respect for the referee's decision.

4. All sporting teams must adhere to the safety requirements of the sporting competition entered. This refers, in particular, to the wearing of mouth guards, shin guards, helmets and other protective equipment required in some sports.

5. Each sporting team will carry a first aid kit.

The School Day

The school teaching day runs from 9.00am to 3.10pm, with sports and cultural activities held either during breaks or before/after school.

House System:

Wentworth operates a family 'House' pastoral care structure, with every student placed in a House from the time of their enrolment.

School Bus Service:

A Wentworth contracted bus service operates from Orewa with pick-up points through Red Beach and along the Whangaparaoa Peninsula. The school also runs 3 of its own buses, with students coming from as far afield as Matakana in the North, Kaukapakapa in the West and North Shore in the South.

Standards of Behaviour:

While at school students are expected to behave with courtesy and consideration, thus contributing to an environment of mutual respect and support.

Behaviour Outside School:

When travelling to and from school, the school uniform must be worn correctly and a high standard of conduct exhibited at all times. Students should be aware that when in uniform, their conduct reflects upon both themselves and the reputation of the school.

General:

Students are under the school's authority from the time they leave home to come to Wentworth Primary School until they return home, or at any function held under the control of Wentworth Primary School.

Electronic games, CD players, iPods, matches, lighters, or any dangerous implements must not be brought to school.

All clothing, books and sports gear must be clearly named. No responsibility will be taken for lost property, but considerable effort will be made to find it if clothing and equipment are named. Students are not to chew gum.

Internet and Computer use:

All students at Wentworth Primary and a parent/ caregiver must sign a Computer Agreement, indicating their acceptance of, and agreement with, the conditions of use stipulated in the Agreement. Disciplinary action will be taken against any student found to be breaching the terms of the Agreement.

Homework

Students at Wentworth Primary School receive regular homework, set to allow students to practise and consolidate skills previously taught at school and to develop personal study skills. Homework is expected to be completed or a note should be produced.

Homework includes:

- Reading
- Spelling
- Mathematics

Parents can assist by:

- taking an interest in homework
- checking a student's homework
- helping students plan their time
- providing a quiet place or room

Textbooks and Stationery:

It is the student's responsibility to ensure that school textbooks are cared for and returned after use in the best possible condition. Damage resulting from lack of care will be charged.

Wentworth Friends and Families:

'Wentworth Friends and Families' is a body of parents and friends whose children either attend or have attended Wentworth Primary. 'Wentworth Friends and Families' are passionate about Wentworth Primary and aspire to promote the unique character of the School with its focus on the family and values. If you have a child at our school then you are automatically part of 'Wentworth Friends and Families' and we ask for your support, ideas and a little contribution of your time throughout the School year.

After School Care:

Wentworth Primary After School Care provides a safe and stimulating, and positive environment, with child focused activities. It is a program, where children are able to play under safe supervision. Children have the opportunities to learn, do their homework, play games, play with friends, read a book, create art, or imaginative play. A balanced, varied program that allows children to self-select age appropriate child based activities, both indoor and Outdoor.

After School Care is available from 3:10pm to 5:45pm during school days.

Matthew Farrow - Teacher of Year 6 Science *B.Ed.*




