Senior students are now in examination mode with external Cambridge examinations having

commenced and running throughout Term 4. We wish all our students the very best for the month ahead.

A very comprehensive and successful winter sports programme operated during the last term with excellent results for many teams. The large number of students representing the school is to be



celebrated, with a participation level of over 70% compared to the national average of only 52%. Congratulations to all of our sports teams and a huge thank you to all of the coaches, managers and supporters for helping to make the season so successful.

The Wentworth Board of Trustees has received the 'confirmed' Education Review Office report from the ERO office. The report is published on the Ministry of Education and Wentworth College websites. It is interesting to note that the 2012 review comprises less than 2 pages compared to our first review in 2003 of 5 pages. This reflects a major change of the auditing process by ERO towards Private schools. They have been directed to reduce the size of the report document and are under very strict guidelines with the terminology they can use in writing the final report.

The Education Act with regard to Private school reviews is defined simply, stating that schools should have "suitable standards of curriculum, teaching, premises and resources." ERO confirms that Wentworth College meets all criteria for registration set out in the Education Act 1989.

The review officers congratulated the school on the continuation of the high quality of educational opportunities and high expectation of achievement that have been evident in all of Wentworth College's reviews.

They acknowledged the high quality of the school facilities and were impressed by the number of sporting and cultural opportunities available.

Mention is made in the report of the individual

attention that is given to students' educational needs and development, guiding them towards learning pathways that suit students' and parents' aspirations and leading to confident, cooperative and happy learners who are achieving well in all areas of the curriculum.

Evidence of student achievement was noted, as it is clearly reflected in past years' academic results with over 90% of Wentworth students in Year 13 gaining their University Entrance qualification last year.

The school's vision of developing a caring, supportive environment that leads to well engaged, motivated students, also brought positive comment from the ERO team.

The implementation of the Cambridge International Examination system has led to a continued rise of student achievement and planning is now in place to further extend the teaching of the Cambridge curriculum in to Wentworth Primary. This will lead to a seamless and co-ordinated programme for students attending Wentworth schools.

Year 8 Spanish students took part in a lesson this term to try out typical Spanish foods. This was a lesson particularly enjoyed by all.




Mathematics Week


Sunderland Sports Exchange
